About the University of West Georgia

The University of West Georgia is a comprehensive, public university in Carrollton and Newnan, Georgia. UWG supports students in their efforts to complete degrees in relevant programs, valuing professional preparation and the liberal arts.

Through effective and innovative teaching, experiential learning, scholarship, research, creative endeavor, and public service.



UWG equips graduates to engage with and discover knowledge. UWG is dedicated to building on existing strengths and developing distinctive academic, research, and co-curricular programs and services that respond to economic development and identified regional, state, and global needs, thus empowering its 79,000+ alumni to contribute responsibly and creatively to a complex 21st-century global society.



UWG is the seventh-largest public university in Georgia and set an enrollment record with 14,394 students in the fall of 2024, with students from 31 other states and 40 other countries enrolled. The university offers 106 fields of study, including bachelor's, master's, specialist, and doctoral programs, as well as post-baccalaureate and post-master's certificates. UWG is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and

Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) and is classified as a Level VI University, the highest level possible.

Founded in 1906, UWG grew from a district agricultural and mechanical school to a two-year institution and then a four-year college in 1957. UWG achieved university status in 1996. Fielding 15 teams in NCAA Division I athletics, UWG also boasts a cheerleading team with 35 national championships. The university generates \$614 million annually in economic impact, providing a safe, quality, and affordable college experience that transforms lives.

Colleges & Schools

With programs of study ranging from computing to business management and mathematics to theatre, the University of West Georgia connects students with careers that will improve the quality of their lives and elevate the trajectory of their families for generations to come. About the University System of Georgia

The University System of Georgia is composed of 26 higher education institutions, including four research universities, four comprehensive universities, nine state universities, and nine state colleges. It also includes the Georgia Public Library Service, which encompasses approximately 389 facilities within the 61 library systems throughout the State of Georgia. Additionally, the USG includes the Georgia Archives, which identifies, collects, manages, preserves, and provides access to records and information about Georgia.

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia oversees the public colleges and universities that comprise the University System of Georgia and has oversight of the Georgia Archives and the Georgia Public Library Service. The Board of Regents is composed of 19 members, five of whom are appointed from the state-at-large, and one from each of the state's 14 congressional districts.

About the UWG Foundation

While state funding provides financial support for the university, charitable giving funds many scholarships and improvements to our academic programs. The UWG Foundation was created in 1967 for the express purpose of raising, administering, investing, and transferring private gifts for the University of West Georgia. The foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. It receives all gifts to the university and distributes them as per the donor's instructions. It also determines the distribution of annual funds dollars.

The mission of the University of West Georgia Foundation, Inc. is to support the University of West Georgia in its mission to provide excellent higher education to its constituencies. It does so by attracting and involving leaders from among the University's alumni and friends in this endeavor. The Foundation primarily focuses on attracting, receiving, investing, managing, and expending gifts and other resources. This supports the university's educational programs, research projects, and community service efforts as identified in the strategic planning process.


